

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

American Customer Satisfaction Index University of Michigan





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


FAFSA On the Web


FSA Portal Strategy







FSA Technology



Technology approach

- Re-engineer business processes organizing data by student rather than federal program (Common Record)
- Integrate using an Enterprise Application Integration (EAI) bus (MQ series)
- Use Internet for data exchanges (SAIG, December 21, 2001)
- Use Web, Internet technologies



Use of middleware

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"In selecting middleware, [FSA] has adopted a viable, industry-accepted means for integrating and utilizing its existing data on student loans and grants.

"... this new technology should help ameliorate some of [FSA's] longstanding database integration problems—problems that have contributed to slow and inconvenient loan servicing and internal control weaknesses."



Postsecondary Electronic Standards Council (PESC)

PESC and FSA have agreed to:

- Support and use formal standards
- Where appropriate, use federal electronic standards (such as FIPS)
- Use relevant industry standards
- "PESC commits to serve in the standards-setting role."



XML Forum Recommendations

- ebXML Business Messaging and Registry
- Core Components Data Dictionary
 - Financial Aid (including Common Record)
 - Student Records

Implied:

- XML data exchanges
- Internet Engineering Task Force (IETF) and World Wide Web (W3C) standards



Common Origination and Disbursement (COD)

- XML-based Common Record
- Process "student-based" submissions
- Near-real time processing with capability to support real-time transactions
- On-line reports
- For contingency, backward compatible using MQ translation

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A possible future

- FSA supports "real" wireless applications
- FSA portlets become available for use on college and university portals
- Real-time integration with school business systems - the "Florida State University" model

All increase direct access to FSA on-line services

Focus on Privacy and Security



Strengthening privacy and security

- Encrypting data exchanges
- Using approved electronic signatures for electronic documents
- Confirming student identication using records of other government agencies
- Restricting internal access to authorized staff
- Increased physical security, continuity options



"Transitive trust" pilot

Institutional identification using

- Digital certificates or other organizational electronic credentials
- Real-time validation
- Trust and honor partner's
 - Individual's electronic credential

or

- SAML assertions
- Encryption using TLS (SSL)



Future practices

- Real-time business messages
 - Strong encrypted transmission (IETF TLS)
 - Identification of both parties (IETF digital certificates, OCSP real-time validation)
 - SAML authentication and authorization assertions (in the SOAP message)
- Electronic documents
 - Electronic signatures (W3C, IETF)
 - Electronic promissory notes
