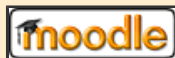

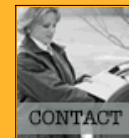

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About Moodle

Moodle is software that helps teachers to communicate with their students in an active, collaborative on-line environment.



With Moodle, students and teachers share assignments, multimedia and course documents in a pedagogically sound environment. Teachers construct activities for students to explore at any time of day. Students and teachers enjoy the time and space to provide thoughtful, detailed, and uncompromised feedback to each other.

The word "Moodle" is a verb that describes the process of creatively meandering through the various activities of a course, an enjoyable tinkering that often leads to insight and creativity. As such it applies both to the way Moodle is actively developed, and to the way a student or teacher might approach studying or teaching an online course.

Who Made Moodle?



Moodle is an ongoing project created by Martin Dougiamas of Perth, Australia. The open-source code is available at moodle.org, and an active group of educators and developers contribute daily to the evolution of the software.

Martin has contributed significantly to the Thinking Distance project as well. His degrees in computer science and education, along with his generous vision for this software have created a paradigm shift of collaborative possibilities for schools.

Moodle was created as a tool for pedagogical enhancement, not



just as a free replacement for software like Blackboard or WebCT. Martin built Moodle on a social constructivism chassis.

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Mission and Values

Mission:

Thinking Distance is a non-profit organization that brings Moodle e-learning software to teachers and schools.

We believe that Moodle is "the killer app" for educators and learners. As a freely distributed product, it makes the best e-learning technology available to everyone. We are in a unique position as educators to know how such a tool can transform our profession.

Thinking Distance supports teachers and schools by hosting Moodle e-learning classrooms. We also provide training as well as technical and pedagogical resources for teachers.

Values:

- We are building a community of like-minded teachers seeking to extend and enrich the learning experiences of their students. We are also fostering a community of educators who understand that teaching is a collaborative effort.
- We believe teachers and students learn more when they scaffold their knowledge off each other.
- We value good teaching and desire to compensate innovative teachers for sharing their good ideas with others. Moodle allows those ideas to become replicable and repeatable.
- We are helpful with teacher training, critical in teacher support, and inventive in promoting cross-school collaborations that are possible.



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Philosophy

The foundation of our philosophy borrows from the tool that we prescribe: **Moodle** is designed with social constructionist underpinnings. Moodle classrooms engage students in inquiry and help them sharpen their communication skills. Moreover, because students are often constructing shared information in Moodle forums and glossaries, they learn to write for a larger audience, they learn to build on the ideas of others, and they begin to consider their collective words as some kind of shared artifact or compelling transcript.

Our organization chooses to build, like a good teacher, a collaborative community of learners by taking measures to be responsive, collegial, diverse, cutting-edge, and content-rich.

Rather than practice "hit it and quit it" teacher training, we are building long-term relationships between teachers from all over the world who are reflecting on their practice and expanding what they know. Our "Faculty Room" is a responsive community that builds a body of resources and discussions every day. We look at our past words and deeds with a sense of authorship and an element of pride. In this way, our collaboration with each other is a constant reminder of what we wish to replicate for our students.



We see the constructivist pedagogy that animates Moodle as a way for students and teachers to become reflective about the way they learn and how their own vision of the world is constructed with the help of others. We find that on-line learning demands extra listening and articulation skills. We believe this extra effort may be the most essential element of any person's education. Further, we suspect that true communication, facilitated by e-learning, might be one of our best opportunities to dismantle cultural barriers.

Given the fact that Moodle is freely distributed around the world and is being adopted and advocated at rapid rates by



international communities like UNESCO, we sense that this is the time and tool that may change ways that schools, countries, and cultures share and collaborate. For this reason, we choose to create a content-rich environment that gives more than it takes: we want to water and witness opportunity. We know our approach is different from the corporate tradition, but this difference inspires us every day to think about the seeds of good-learning.

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Strategy

Strategy:

- Thinking Distance supports teachers and schools by hosting Moodle e-learning classrooms and offering pedagogical and technical support for teachers. Because Moodle is a freely distributed learning tool, our service and teacher community keep our organization unique.
- We have structured our business as a non-profit organization so that we may apply for and administer grants which position us as a Moodle content incubator. We aim to be a resource that pays teachers creation and royalty fees for course development.
- We view our growing community of hosted classrooms as a prime meeting spot for experts and professionals to visit and engage our students in new ways. The increasing size of our community allows Thinking Distance to leverage grants to fund such visits.

We believe our organization also offers significant financial rewards to our clients. Because Moodle is freely distributed and because we have found affordable ways to host, train, and support teachers, an investment in our endeavors is equal to a much larger investment in education. For example, Thinking Distance supports medium-sized schools for about \$3500 a year, whereas giants like Blackboard charge about \$10,000 more a year in fees. If Thinking Distance hosts ten schools a year, we're saving taxpayers and parents about \$60,000 a year. If we host one hundred schools, we're saving them \$650,000. One thousand schools equal \$6.5 million in savings and ten thousand schools represents \$650 million dollars that can be reinvested in other elements of our schools.



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Hello from Baltimore, Maryland, USA!

I'm Tom Murdock, one of many teachers involved with Moodle at Thinking Distance. In 2004 I founded this 501c3 non-profit organization with my friend, Bob McDonald. Now I continue to invite and involve talented and dedicated individuals into the Thinking Distance family of staff, strategic partners, and clients. We have technicians, course design specialists, trainers, and on-line Moodle mentors.



I currently teach at St. Paul's School in Baltimore, Maryland where I use Moodle as a tool for my regular day-to-day classes. I am the product of an arts-based education at Interlochen Arts Academy and Princeton University. In both schools, I studied writing, literature, and education and suspect that since my teachers and parents always encouraged me to place my ideas into memorable "artifacts" or "containers" (poems, essays, letters, etc..), I have been moodling most of my life.

I've been teaching secondary English literature courses for the past fourteen years at day and boarding schools in the United States. During that time, I've been a classroom teacher, a boarding school advisor, a wilderness expedition leader, the English department chairperson at two schools, and the administrator of a number of writing and art programs.

I started Thinking Distance, Inc. as a way to bring Moodle to more teachers. To date, we're pleased to support more than 5000 students who use Moodle daily. Check out the variety of learners using Moodle with us:

- a college MBA program in Sustainable Management integrating environmental, ethical and social values with practical business skills.
- low-income sixth graders in a New York State school, more than half of them moodling with English as a second language.
- nursing students studying geriatric health care in Missouri
- academically challenging secondary schools in three states and two countries



- teachers advancing their knowledge of evaluation and assessment from a division of a state's Special Education program
- court-ordered clients seeking on-line instructive lessons for driving under the influence from professional counselors
- college classrooms in Malaysia, Japan, Ontario, Korea, Guam, Australia and Portugal.
- a non-profit all-voluntary womens' group uses Moodle to plan and coordinate organizational development and community building activities. This maximizes their face-to-face time to provide direct services as community volunteers.

Four years ago in my Baltimore apartment, I stumbled across an early version of Moodle on the internet and wanted to try it. When Martin Dougiamas, Moodle's creator, offered to zap into my Macintosh computer from Australia to install the software, I would never have expected to have become so enthralled with the project.

Since that time, I've been an active supporter of the international Moodle open-source development project (at moodle.org), and I no longer dream of starting new schools, but instead envision meaningfully connecting existing ones.

I'm enthusiastic about Moodle because it is freely distributed, because it is culturally dynamic, and because it doesn't automate teaching -- it simply brings us closer to our students.

After we get our schools communicating differently then we can begin the fun work of bringing a world of people into our classrooms. I'm thinking about artists, writers, politicians, shopkeepers, environmentalists, world travelers, carpenters, etc.. Our world as a classroom... Students as authentic problem solvers...

Please join our mission to connect talented teachers with Moodle. Martin has his hands full and depends on a number of us to get teachers rolling.

Bob McDonald and Tom Murdock, the co-founders of Thinking Distance, Inc. present **Using Moodle to Connect Learning Communities**

Moodle open-source software has grown rapidly in the past three years and now challenges the leading corporate LMS products. Listed as recommended educational software by UNESCO, Moodle is designed with social constructionist underpinnings and presents independent schools with an opportunity to extend learning experiences for their students while leveraging their educational resources beyond the classroom walls. This presentation examines the way Moodle enhances and alters the delivery of content and process as well as traces the ways teachers and students are using this transformative tool to collaborate across borders.



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Three Moodle Presentations at Society for Information Technology and Teacher Education (SITE), International Conference in Phoenix, Arizona, March 3, 2005.

Executive Performance partners Sheila D. Gatling and Gina Russell Stevens have collaborated with State University of New York College at Old Westbury chemistry professor, Duncan A. Quarless, PhD, to co-present three papers highlighting Moodle implementations at the 16th annual SITE International Conference. This annual conference offers opportunities to share ideas and expertise on all topics related to the use of information technology in teacher education and instruction about information technology for all disciplines in preservice, inservice, and graduate teacher education as well as faculty and staff development.

SITE is an international association of individual teacher educators, and affiliated organizations of teacher educators in all disciplines, who are interested in the creation and dissemination of knowledge about the use of information technology in teacher education and faculty/staff development. The Society seeks to promote research, scholarship, collaboration, exchange, and support among its membership, and to actively foster the development of new national organizations where a need emerges. SITE is the only organization that has as its sole focus the integration of instructional technologies into teacher education programs.

Building An Articulated Culturally Dynamic Learning Community of Practice Using MOODLE:

One of the major challenges confronting global society during the Information Age is building and sustaining scalable, flexible and affordable infrastructure models to support the unique lifelong learning needs of geographically and demographically disparate individuals. This challenge is further complicated by an unarticulated system of formal, informal and non-formal educational providers serving learners in primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary educational settings. Moodle is an open source course management system that supports culturally dynamic instructional design for diverse lifelong learners. This pilot will document the development of and explore implications for further study of Moodle's efficacy as a scalable, flexible and affordable virtual articulated culturally dynamic community of practice... a "micro" learning society that includes schools, universities, communities and businesses.

A Case Study: E-Learning Strategies for Diverse Middle



School Students:

The emerging significance of e-learning in higher education and the workplace compels educational professionals and policy makers to provide preparatory e-learning experiences for primary and secondary students. Instructional designers must consider how students learn, cultural background and developmental considerations in constructing effective experiences. This paper will present a case study documenting how the course management system, Moodle, facilitates a culturally dynamic learning environment for diverse middle school students. It will demonstrate how integrating Moodle into the classroom engages students, thus, enabling them to incorporate e-learning into both cognitive and metacognitive processes.

T.I.M.E. - A Prototype Model for Designing Culturally Dynamic Science e-Learning Communities:

In an era of scientific and technological innovation and progress, underrepresented minorities continue to lag in all educational science and engineering performance indicators (NCES, 2004), while demonstrating proficiency using recreational technologies. Science educators need to design and implement models that exploit the learning styles, multiple intelligences and unique cultural backgrounds of diverse students. While a scientific career path may not be suitable for the vast majority of students, the knowledge, skills and attitudes acquired in scientific endeavor yield lifelong benefits for everyone. Therefore, there exists a two-fold impetus to engage underrepresented minorities in science learning. This paper will present the prototype T.I.M.E. Model for facilitating culturally dynamic scientific online e-learning communities using Moodle.
