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Little Change In Student Attitudes Toward Employer Commitment, Work Hours

Student attitudes about their commitment to their employer and the number of hours they are willing to work each week have changed little since 1982, according to results of NACE's *2010 Student Survey*. In 1982, 76.6 percent of college seniors planned to stay with their employers for more than two years. That number is up slightly—to 78.4 percent—in the 2010 survey.

The percentage of the graduating class willing to work more than 40 hours per week has dipped since 1982, when 86.7 indicated their willingness to do so. This year, 83.4 percent reported their willingness to work beyond typical work hours.

NACE's *2010 Student Survey* was conducted February 9, 2010, through April 30, 2010. More than 31,470 students representing more than 400 colleges and universities nationwide took part; more than 13,000 of those were graduating seniors. A final report on the study's findings will be available later this year.
