This roadmap is the OSPI community's guide for developing the open source portfolio (OSP). It is a living document that reflects current thinking and planning for creating future versions of the software. Our vision describes what we aspire to and this roadmap describes how we will reach our aspirations.

Why a roadmap?

- As a communication vehicle it keeps us all aligned with the same goals and priorities. The beauty of our open source model is that we don't know exactly *where* we'll end up or *when* we'll get there. Our roadmap sets us off in a direction that is continuously refined as we learn and adapt. However, your priorities might be slightly different. You might have something to add that we haven't thought of. Therefore our actual evolution will be more organic than depicted here. We'll do much more, in less time because you will contribute and we can't plan for that because it's unknown. Please discuss the roadmap in the forums.

- It defines goals for each release and so defines what it means to be successful.
