2. Agora -- Online Meeting Tool for Sakai, Beta Available for Downloading

The centre for e-Science in Lancaster University (UK) has released this week the first beta version of Agora, an online meeting tool integrated in Sakai. This tool features:

- Multivideo conference
- Collaborative whiteboard
- Shared desktop
- Moviecasting
- Instant messaging
- Recording capabilities

This very first beta version can be installed easily in any Sakai server (2.2 or above). For running the clients it is necessary windows XP or 2000 (we are preparing versions for Linux, Windows Vista, and Mac but it will take a while).

As a beta version, this is a testing version. We are looking for people for helping us in finding bugs, giving us comments, critics and suggestions. Also it would be nice if developers with skills in graphics programming, JNI, QuickTime for java, JMF,

experience with codecs, etc. will collaborate with us in this open source project.

Also, in this testing and continuous improving process we would like to keep in contact as much as possible with the collaborators in order to maximize the value of the feedback.

All the information about Agora can be found in <http://agora.lancs.ac.uk> (This page is changing almost everyday with updated information.) There you can find the binary files for downloading and installing. Source code will be available next week (we need to solve little issues with licensing -- very likely it will be Apache 2.0 licence) and copyrighting.

3. TransformAble Now Part of Sakai

The TransformAble package is now a part of Sakai. TransformAble is being developed by the Adaptive Technology Resource Centre at the University of Toronto. It is useful for users who want to customize Sakai's appearance to improve the readability and accessibility. TransformAble consists of two parts:

StyleAble is a component that generates customized style sheets based on a user's stated preferences, allowing them to control the overall appearance of the site, including the font size, face, foreground colour, background colour, highlight colour, and link

appearance. User preferences are created through a tool currently called PreferAble, which (once un-stealthed) can be added to any workspace.

StyleAble is now available (but disabled) in the new Velocity portal. When you check out the portal from the branch, the TransformAble code will be included, in a subfolder 'transformable.' Building the new portal will build transformable as well.

To activate StyleAble, you will need to set
portal.styleable=true
in sakai.properties

We're continuing to fix bugs and improve the user experience in preparation for the 2.4 release, so you'll probably see lots of activity from us over the next little while.

4. 2.1.x-ers: Important WebDAV Security Patch for /dav/attachment/*

Hey, All:

As I hope all of your security contacts know already, a WebDAV vulnerability was located that allowed read/write/modify/delete access to the yourdomain.edu/dav/attachment/ folder and its subfolders.

In order to close this hole, it was decided that no one, including the admin user, should have dav access to the /dav/attachment/ folder, its subfolders, and their content.

As a result, a patch was written (thanks, Lance!), ported to 2.1.x (thanks Jenn at Yale!), reviewed by one of the Foundation's technical leads (thanks, Chuck!), and, finally, QA'd by myself.

This patch has been applied to the 2.1.x maintenance branch (r21083); I have also uploaded the 2.1.x patch to SAK-7672:

5. Sakai 2.3.1 Released

The Sakai Foundation announces the release of the Sakai Collaboration and Learning Environment, version 2.3.1.

Sakai 2.3.1 is a security update that addresses two critical security vulnerabilities in the Sakai 2.3.0 maintenance release. Anyone running unpatched versions of 2.3.0 should upgrade to 2.3.1 immediately.

Demo, binary and source installs of Sakai 2.3.1 are available at:

Sakai 2.3.1 closes the following security vulnerabilities:

- 1) directory listings of Sakai content hosting collections open to unauthenticated and unauthorized web browsing of email attachment folders.
- 2) attachments exposed to unauthorized viewing as well as addition, alteration or deletion through a WebDAV client.

Although no reports of exploitation have been received you should consider carefully the security implications these vulnerabilities pose to your Sakai installation(s).

In addition, Sakai 2.3.1 includes fixes for four additional issues:

- 1) Gradebook tool: runtime exceptions when accessing with existing information.
- 2) Resources tool: usability issues when folders are populated with a large number of entries.
- 3) Admin Workspace: slow performance when viewing resources.
- 4) A Script to add content.hidden permission to existing worksites.

The security vulnerabilities outlined above also affect earlier versions of Sakai. If you are running Sakai 1.0.0, 1.5.x, or 2.0.x we recommend that you upgrade your system

immediately to Sakai 2.3.1. If you are running Sakai 2.2.x we recommend that you upgrade your system immediately to Sakai 2.2.3:
