Strathmore University in Nairobi, Kenya went live as they started their new fiscal year. As you might imagine the implementation had some unique challenges, the greatest was with communications. Congratulations to those whose enormous efforts and contributions resulted in this first "real" success. This is a landmark for the Community Source path to an integrated enterprise solution for HE. There will be hundreds more schools following suit with the Kuali Financial System and, most probably, hundreds more installing Community Source Enterprise modules. You have successfully contributed to the first phase of a business model that will become the new model of choice in years to come. Hopefully this will become even more gratifying for all of us who believe so strongly in the commitment we are making to this model.

MELETE 2.4 Released!

The ETUDES Project team at Foothill College is pleased to announce Melete 2.4! Melete 2.4 is a significant release that introduces integration of Melete with Sakai's content hosting. Other highlights of Melete 2.4 include sub-section support for up to 10 levels (per section), integration with 'import from site,' licensing of learning objects and content at the section level, re-use of site material, i18n internationalization support, and much more.

See readme files included in the release packages for installation or upgrade steps to Melete 2.4, or for Sakai 2.3.x patch instructions.

Please note that as Melete's content is now stored in content hosting instead of filesystem, upgrading to Melete 2.4 from Melete 2.3m2 requires serious migration of content. A migration program is included in the release and makes the process easy. Depending on how much content you have in MeleteDocs, the migration may take a while. With thousands of sites with Melete, our migration took about 3 hours.



5. Kaleidoscope 2007 Symposium -- Interface for Researchers, Industry Representatives and Policy Makers -- Agenda Now Online

Kaleidoscope has announced the program for its 2007 Symposium. Europe's leading research network in the field of technology-enhanced learning (TEL) will host the event from November 26 to 27 at the Hotel InterContinental in Berlin, Germany.

The Kaleidoscope 2007 Symposium is the only international forum this year that brings together Europe's leading scientists in the field of technology-enhanced learning with a diverse set of stakeholders including policy makers, industry representatives, and endusers. At the two-day event participants will discuss the latest developments and future research priorities relating to the use of technology in learning. The symposium serves to demonstrate the impact, excellence, key synergies, and value of research in the field. World-renowned experts Prof. Roger Säljö, University of Gothenburg, Sweden, and Francesc Pedró, Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), France, will open the event with keynote presentations.

On the first day, Kaleidoscope researchers will present, exhibit, and demonstrate the tangible outcomes of the unique activities undertaken over the last four years. Sessions will cover areas such as mobile, inquiry, and collaborative learning, as well as the use of design patterns and trails in learning. A focus will be set on a range of crucial issues and potential solutions, from new needs arising in work-place learning to the challenges concerning setting scientific quality criteria for TEL research. The first day will be concluded by Sten Ludvigsen, Scientific Manager of the Kaleidoscope Network, presenting a keynote entitled "Learning across Sites: Crossing Boundaries with Digital Resources".

Prof. Frank Fischer, Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität, Munich, Germany, Dr. Vanda Luengo, Université Joseph Fourier, Grenoble, France, and Prof. Diana Laurillard, London Knowledge Lab, London, UK, kick off the symposium's second day. Their keynotes will tackle current issues relating to research in the technology-enhanced learning field and provide the framework for a range of discussion sessions with researchers and stakeholder representatives. These highly interactive discussions will focus on the relevance of research activities to the needs of stakeholders, ways to improve communication of research priorities and suggestions for enhancing the impact of research.

In an adjoining exhibition area, the multidisciplinary research teams will showcase their activities through hands-on demonstrations and poster displays, as well as make available copies of reports, best practices, resource guides and other research outcomes.
