promoted to Core for 2.5. The tools themselves are large and important components of Sakai and, especially in the case of Tests & Quizzes, often come under special scrutiny on campus. Graded tests justifiably make students and instructors especially attentive, and we want to ensure their confidence in Sakai is high. Since a number of institutions are running the 2.4 version of Tests & Quizzes in production for the first time during this term, we'll be looking at their experiences as the term progresses to identify any items that could benefit from additional attention. I would also ask for a strong community support in assisting with Quality Assurance for 2.5 (especially from those groups who expressed support for the promotion of Tests & Quizzes and OSP). We need your help to ensure that these new core Sakai tools are as dependable as possible.

Assessment and Portfolio functionality are critically important to users of Sakai. Please join me in offering congratulations to the teams that have worked so hard and well on these projects over the years. Thank you! Your efforts are much appreciated.

After an eight-month-long pilot project, we are so pleased to announce our official production at Sabanci University. Based on a year-long evaluation of Sabanci University's needs, we have decided to take advantages of more flexible and efficient projects instead of WebCT. So, at this point Sabanci University has decided to adopt as

our new course management system Sakai, which has wide array of features to replace current system.

As we stated before, there were some reasons for making these decisions. With the evolution and trends of online course management systems in higher education, and also valuable feedback and survey results from campus users about the current CMS application, we needed to reevaluate our current situation to continue with a suitable and stable online learning environment.

Due to following advantages,

- Flexibility (Open Source) and fast improvement
- Easy to use
- Prevalence in higher education
- Rich features and modular infrastructure

- Integration capabilities (uPortal, Pluto, etc.)

4. August 10, 2007: UC Berkeley Launches 2.4.x and Retires Blackboard

Dear Colleagues -- UC Berkeley officially launched its new release of bSpace for the Fall 2007. Moving from 2.1.2 to 2.4.x will be a huge improvement for users, and we have many of you to thank for this. After this point we intend to be as aligned with the .x branch as possible.

In addition to the features included in the 2.4.x branch we are including Indiana University's Forum tool, Boston University's Mailtool, and the University of Capetown's Poll tool. We also now have a fresh face, with a vastly improved skin, which not only looks good, but greatly assists users navigating Sakai.

As of July 31, we no longer host or support courses in either Blackboard or WebCT, making Sakai the sole enterprise LMS on the Berkeley campus. To prove it, just go ahead and visit blackboard.berkeley.edu and see what you get!

Again -- thanks to all of you for your outstanding dedication and work on Sakai. I can say with absolute confidence that the power of community source has been realized.

5. Questions & Answers Tool to be Developed by UNISA and UCT

UNISA (University of South Africa) and UCT (University of Cape Town) would like to share our plans to develop a new tool for Sakai, Q&A (Questions and Answers).

Q&A enables students to ask questions anonymously, which can be answered by other students or lecturers/tutors (instructors/TAs). Questions are ranked by the popularity of their answers, and can also be organized into categories, tagged and searched.

Q&A builds on experiences from UNISA and UCT with two complementary legacy tools, viz. UNISA's FAQ tool (<http://confluence.sakaiproject.org/confluence/display/QNA/About+FAQ>) and UCT's DFAQ tool (<http://confluence.sakaiproject.org/confluence/display/QNA/About+DFAQ>).

FAQ is heavily used at UNISA to enable lecturers to respond to similar questions asked by large numbers of students. DFAQ is used for a range of purposes at UCT, including to provide formative diagnostic feedback to lecturers and course convenors about difficult areas of the course curriculum or content, supporting exam revision by students, and improving governance.

UNISA is leading the project, and will be providing project management and contracting a South African IT company to undertake the majority of the coding for phase 1 (as one of the project's goals is to build local IT industry capacity in developing for Sakai). UCT

will be contributing to tool design, technical oversight and QA. Both institutions will support the tool in the long term. The tool will use RSF and probably Hibernate as technologies.

The project is planned to complete phase 1 of the tool for deployment by Jan/Feb 2008, and if ready, proposed as a Sakai provisional tool for 2.6 or 2.7.

UNISA and UCT welcome feedback and involvement from anyone interested in the tool or planning similar work.
