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1. From the Executive Director

We just completed a fantastic 9th Sakai Conference in Paris. Despite some logistical challenges (the hotel was too far away from the University) and unwelcome heat & humidity (and insufficient air conditioning in some rooms), it was a very successful week. Overall, over 50% of the participants were from outside North America, so the goal of having more European and African participants was achieved. It was all made possible by our colleagues at Université Pierre et Marie Curie who really can't be thanked too much for all the work they did.

Everyone has a different experience of the conference, of course, and mine is probably one of the most unusual. Still, I thought it was worth noting a few highlights from my week at the conference:

The teaching and learning community emerged. Wednesday was emblematic of this. The morning opened with the presentation of the first Sakai Teaching and Learning Innovation Awards, followed by Diana Laurillard's excellent keynote address, presentations from both of the Sakai T&L Award winners and, finally, an excellent panel

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discussion with Diana, Josh Baron, a Chuck Severance and Maggie Lynch. You can see these presentations (and others!) on the page UPMC used for webcasting the conference:

-- The "Better, Faster, Lighter Sakai UX" presentation from the folks at CARET and Nathan Pearson's UX Improvement presentation. CARET has been working on a new way of developing Sakai tools using JavaScript "gadgets" that consume JSON formatted data provided by the underlying Java services. All this work is clearly an important development for Sakai and that should produce a number of significant benefits for the community. CARET has a (slightly out-of-date) page on the Sakai wiki:

-- The focus on building a "content/page authoring" capability for Sakai. A number of folks are working on this and have tool prototypes available. These range from structured (OpenSyllabus by University of Montreal and HEC Montreal) to semi-structured (the Subject Research Guides from Sakaibrary) to unstructured (free form editing in OSP and some interesting widget-based work from Cambridge). We all agreed that there is an underlying set of capabilities that are shared and that we should be able to combine efforts in some way. Stay tuned.

The next "Sakai Community Conference" will be in June 2009 in the Eastern half of the United States (we're hoping for Boston). In the meantime, a number of regional events are cropping up:

- A mid-November meeting at Virginia Tech
- A European regional meeting early next year, perhaps in February
- An Australian regional meeting, perhaps in November
- A South African meeting, perhaps in May
- A development-focused working session in Berkeley in November or December

3. New Sakai Membership Options Available

Greetings,

I'd like to announce two new Sakai Foundation membership options designed to make it easier for the community to support the Sakai Foundation. As you may know, current membership levels are \$10,000 annually for larger schools and all commercial affiliates and \$5000 for smaller schools (<3,000 in enrollment).

The first new option applies to Sakai Commercial Affiliate (SCA) members. As of July 1, commercial affiliate membership fees will be based on a sliding scale. Membership will be \$2,000 per \$1,000,000 in revenues. The minimum fee will be \$2,000 and the maximum will be \$10,000 as before. For existing SCAs, this pricing will apply at the time of their renewal.

The second option introduces a three-year membership at a 20% discount. Current membership dues for larger schools are \$10,000 annually and the 3-year membership would be \$24,000. For schools at the \$5,000 membership level, dues for a three-year membership would be \$12,000. This 3-year membership discount is also available to Sakai Commercial Affiliates (although a minimum of \$2,000 annually would still apply).

4. Announcing Mneme 1.1.8!

Mneme 1.1.8 is available for Sakai 2.3.x, Sakai 2.4.x, or Sakai 2.5.

If you are running an earlier version of Mneme, please upgrade to 1.1.8; we will not be supporting earlier versions. As Mneme is still a young muse, we need you to keep up with us. Upgrading to Mneme 1.1.8 is simple. You'll need to take Mneme, Ambrosia, and TinyMCE. No conversion is required. There was a bad bug in TinyMCE 3.0.8, so please be sure to get TinyMCE 3.0.9 (link on our download page).

Mneme 1.1.8 has been run in production in Etudes since mid-June.

WHAT'S NEW IN MNEME 1.1.8

Outside of bug fixes since the 1.1.4 public release, the key highlight of this release is an import utility that allows instructors to port their assignments from the Assignments and onto Mneme in a few clicks.

If you're interested in learning more about ePortfolios, please visit rSmart's new Portfolio Showcase (http://www.rsmart.com/portfolios). This website offers everything you need to understand, create, and implement a model portfolio for each of three common use cases.

Each page of the showcase contains links that take you deeper and deeper into one of the three exemplars. We provide a zip file for each exemplar too, so you can download the files needed and actually build the portfolio you've been exploring. These files are yours to use and change as you like.

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In addition to creating the Portfolio Showcase website, we've used the Web Content tool to add the showcase as a tool in the rSmart Sandbox. Anyone can get a Sandbox account, so if you don't have one, you can sign up here: http://www.sakaisandbox.com/xsl-portal. Next, use the Site Setup tool in My Workspace to create a portfolio site. Be sure to check Portfolio Showcase in the tools list displayed during site creation. When you access your new site, you'll see Portfolio Showcase in the list of tools on the left. Click on the tool name and start exploring.

The three showcased portfolios are available to you thanks to the generosity of Kapiolani Community College, Rider University, and the Rhode Island Network for Technology. Over the next several months and more, we hope to post additional examples to help everyone understand the flexibility and power of ePortfolios and -- just as importantly -- understand what's involved in creating them.
