1. SOLO Now in Pilot Phase

North West University (South Africa) will be running SOLO in a pilot phase on a small number of distance students until the end of this year. SOLO will enable these students to work off-line and only go online to synchronize announcements, resource and Melete e-guides. During this time we will resolve any issues that may arise.

The first official release will then be available from early next year. The current release can be seen as pre-release code and the current version is recommended for testing and evaluation purposes. The beta version has been tested with Sakai 2.5.x and is available in SVN at <https://source.sakaiproject.org/contrib/nwu/solo/trunk/>.

Please note the following folders in SVN:

-- soloclient_sakai:

Contains the GWT (Google Web Toolkit) source code that must be compiled to Javascript using the GWT compiler. This code contains good examples of how to use RPC (Remote Procedure Calls) to Sakai, reading remote XML files, populating grids and treeviews etc.

-- soloserver_sakai:

The tool source code. Check out the use of a pure ext-js grid that is integrated into the Solo tool.

-- deployments:

For users that are interested in trying it out. Just check out the latest deployment in the deployments folder and follow the installation instructions in the zip.

In addition, the enhanced system capabilities, particularly the improvements to the Tests & Quizzes and Gradebook tools are being very well received as has been the cleaner Active Sites Tab. UVa appreciates all of the Sakai community's contributions to this new version and all of the positive feedback that is already being received from our users.

In addition to new tools and enhancements to existing tools included in version 2.5, we have also incorporated the Anonymous Feedback tool from Yale and are testing use of the Clicker Registration tool. 5. Call for Proposals -- Sakai Fall 2008 Regional Conference – Deadline: September 8

Dear Sakai/OSP Colleagues,

You are enthusiastically invited to be a part of the Sakai Fall 2008 Regional Conference at Virginia Tech on November 11 and 12, 2008. This conference will offer many opportunities for professional development, strategic planning, and the sharing of best practices.

Proposals are invited which focus on one of two general themes: 1) pedagogy and instructional strategies supported by Sakai, and 2) migration/adoption strategies. Subthemes might include positioning Sakai as a platform for new pedagogies, student engagement, ePortfolio, and assessment. Other topics might include faculty development, user support, marketing Sakai within a legacy scenario, diffusion strategies, and building support for change.
