1. From the Executive Director

I'm pleased to announce an important extension and expansion of the Sakai Foundation User Experience Improvement project. As you know, the Sakai Foundation initially contracted with Nathan Pearson to begin working on new user interaction designs for Sakai. This work has made excellent progress and a variety of schools are assisting with implementation, including UC Berkeley, Cambridge University, Georgia Tech, University of Michigan and Indiana University. You can review the current progress on the Sakai wiki at: <http://confluence.sakaiproject.org/confluence/x/EoDj>.

This work has established significant momentum and we would like to accelerate the progress. To this end, I'm pleased to announce that the Sakai Foundation is establishing a UX Improvement Matching Funds program. For every \$2 in funding provided by donors, the Sakai Foundation will provide an additional \$1 in funds (up to \$40,000).

I'm even more pleased to be able to publicly thank both Stockholm University and Indiana University for their initial pledges of \$15,000 each! This means that we already have an additional \$45,000 to continue the work that has been started. Our goal is a total of \$80,000 in pledged funds plus the \$40k from the Sakai Foundation for a total of \$120,000. Please join me in thanking Stockholm and Indiana for their leadership.

These funds will be used for both design and implementation work on the Sakai UX Improvement Initiative, ensuring that more of the design work that Nathan (and others) produces will find its way into the next Sakai release (after 2.6). While we will use the funds for multiple purposes related to this initiative, we expect a substantial portion of the funds to go towards HTML & JavaScript programming as well as Quality Assurance -- the goal is to ensure the designs are usable in production as quickly as possible. And we'll be establishing a demo server so you can concretely see the progress that is being made.

This method of Foundation-coordinated, community-funded development is a great way to leverage the strength of the community source model. We've all agreed that the Sakai user experience is a priority. Please consider making a contribution of \$1000 or more before the end of November and make it clear that Sakai's user experience is your priority. I'm pleased to announce the availability of Sakai 2.5.3, the second maintenance release of the Sakai Collaboration and Learning Environment in the 2.5 series. This release includes 39 bug fixes and performance enhancements in Assignments, Blog, Database, Entity Broker, Messages, Forums, Worksite Setup/Site Setup and Wiki. This is an important milestone in the changes the community has been making in its release practices as the fixes selected for inclusion in the release targeted a subset of tools. 6. Help Advance Quality in Sakai by Participating in the 2.6 QA Cycle

The 2.6 code freeze is rapidly approaching and it is now time for the community to intensely focus on ensuring the highest quality possible. Many different skills are needed so this is an excellent opportunity for everyone in the community to be involved! For example we need help with:

- Functional Testing -- Writing test plans and executing those tests against specific new features. In addition we need full regression testing as well as verification of bug fixes. This is an area that anyone (UX, Support, developers, etc.) can be involved in.
- Accessibility Testing -- Assure that users who use alternate means of interacting with the system (other than mouse, keyboard, monitor, etc.) experience no difficulty with new features.
- Deployment testing -- Install the latest tag during the release cycle to verify installation success, documentation and scripts. While we get a lot of coverage via the QA network, this does not cover all configurations.
- Release artifact testing -- A less time intensive form of deployment testing.
- Code review -- It is always helpful to have another developer's eyes looking over changes that have occurred. Great opportunity for developers to be involved!
- Log Analysis -- Review logs of QA server network for errors.

Participation by all in the community is strongly encouraged and welcomed! The official QA cycle will run from Oct 6 through the end of February so there is flexibility to work with your availability. 8. Unicon and John Wiley & Sons Contribute Patches to Sakai Community

Unicon, in cooperation with John Wiley & Sons, has committed several patches that are now available for use by the Sakai community. These patches are designed to work with Sakai 2.5.x and include more control over the Worksite Setup and Site Info tools, as well as enhancements to portal navigation. Below is a description of the patches that are now available:

- SAK-13883 enables skin-specific override of VelocityPortalRenderContext configuration and template locations as well as fall-back to the ServerConfigurationService-specified skin in the absence of request- or session-scoped skin specifications.
- SAK-14462 makes it possible to restrict the menu items available in Site Info and Worksite Setup via a single configuration property. Existing menu-item configuration options and business rules are still respected, but new one-off configuration properties should no longer be necessary.
- SAK-14464 also modifies Site Info and Worksite Setup to allow preservation of existing site "joinability" state in the event that corresponding UI features are disabled by configuration.
- SAK-14483 adds a field to the Worksite Setup screen for a site URL alias. The default URL includes the site id -- this patch allows for a user-friendly portal-relative alias at the time of site creation. This alias can then be provided to students for direct access to their course worksite.

Unicon is happy to answer any questions regarding these patches on the appropriate Sakai mailing lists. Since these were not available in time for the 2.6 code freeze, we hope to merge them into the trunk after it goes wild again.

10. rSmart Releases New Sakai Service Pack: rSmart Sakai CLE 2.5.2

rSmart has released its latest Sakai service pack, rSmart Sakai CLE 2.5.2. The service pack delivers to clients 58 bug fixes as well as 17 improvements and minor new features for a total of 75 resolved issues. Based upon Sakai 2.5.3, which was recently released by the Sakai community, many fixed issues were resolved by the Sakai community and picked up and packaged into this release by rSmart. Others were issues rSmart discovered and resolved through the normal course of its ongoing support services with clients. Most

of these fixes were pushed back into the community code base as part of rSmart's code management process.

Part of rSmart's Sakai support and maintenance subscription service includes regular service pack releases for clients. As part of this maintenance service, rSmart tests each fix and regression tests the entire system to ensure that it is ready for immediate deployment. The bi-monthly release of service packs and updates ensures that rSmart support clients are using the latest, most up-to-date Sakai code and provides them with ongoing security, stability, and peak performance for their installations.

"rSmart's package of open source software plus professional support and maintenance provides a much better value to today's teaching institutions for their critical eLearning needs than traditional proprietary and expensive software solutions," said Mike Zackrison, VP of Marketing at rSmart.
