3. Sakai Board Call for Nominations

The Sakai Elections Work Group is pleased to announce the opening of nominations for two positions on the Sakai Foundation Board of Directors. The current terms for John Norman (Cambridge), Chris Coppola (rSmart), and Mara Hancock (Berkeley) expire in December. Ian Dolphin had previously stepped down earlier this year as a result of his new position with eFramework. We are only electing two new board member, instead of three, because the Board of Directors plans to reform the bylaws to allow for appointed board members. More information about the proposed reform will be forthcoming. Electing two new members still provides us with more than the required minimum of seven board members.

The Sakai Foundation is dedicated to the design and development of collaborative, open source software in support of education, research and related scholarly activities. The Board of Directors provides leadership for the Sakai Foundation by serving the interests of the entire Sakai community, promoting the objectives of the Sakai Foundation, representing and coordinating Foundation projects, ensuring that project management is consistent with the Foundation's mission, and that the Foundation operates within its fiscal resources.

The Board of Directors meets at least twice a year at such times and places as designated by the Chair. Board members regularly conduct Board business electronically. Monthly audio conferences have been the norm. Board members are not compensated for their work but expenses will be reimbursed in line with Foundation policies. Nominees will be expected to confirm that their institutional leadership approves of this commitment of time if elected. Board members shall serve for a term of three years. Board members may serve only two consecutive terms. More detailed information about the Sakai Foundation and the responsibilities of the Board of Directors can be found in the Bylaws of the Sakai Foundation.

Nominations must be emailed to sakaelections@umich.edu no later than 5:00 PM EST (GMT-5) on Sunday, November 2, 2008. Anyone can be nominated to stand for election to the Board. Self-nominations are also allowed. Receipt of any nomination you submit will be confirmed. The Elections Work Group will notify all nominees, explain the expectations for board members and confirm their willingness and ability to run for election. If they agree, additional information about them will be solicited.

Board members will be elected by the institutional and corporate representatives as specified in the Sakai Foundation bylaws. A current list of institutional and corporate representatives has been posted at <http://www.sakaiproject.org/portal/site/sakai-foundation>.

The election is scheduled to be conducted online in November with results announced in December.

4. Are You Using Sakai?

It seems that fairly often these days new organizations already running Sakai are popping up on mail lists, commenting in the wiki, etc., which is great! Anyone is of course welcome to download Sakai from the website and start using it without letting us know. However, I would certainly like to encourage folks using Sakai to participate in the community, even just to let us know you're out there! In this respect there are a few things I would like to highlight: Sakai World Map, Deployment Database and Security Contacts List.

The Sakai World map is a Google Map of the locations of Sakai deployments that have self-reported themselves to the Sakai Foundation. If you participate no further, it would be great to have your organization marked on the map on the Sakai website:

The Deployment Database is a place where organizations running Sakai can share information on their software and hardware configurations, as well as support, administration, DBA, etc., staffing levels. It is an excellent source of information for folks both running or considering Sakai to get a feel for what it takes. (If you are already in the database, please take a moment to verify that your information is up-to-date; there are a number of places that we know have upgraded recently, but haven't yet updated their entry.)

The Security Contact List provides a communication channel for announcing Sakai security-related patches. This gives organizations running Sakai a window in which to test and apply such patches before the security issue is publicized. 7. Position Announcement: ePortfolio Project Coordinator

Position Description: ePortfolio Project Coordinator Office of Academic Affairs

Position Summary: The IUPUI Electronic Portfolio (ePort) Initiative seeks a Project Coordinator to help manage the wide array of collaborative efforts involved in launching and maintaining a complex, campus-wide program. The position requires a self-starter who enjoys working with major academic initiatives and moving them forward, can work effectively with faculty and staff, and has strong communication and analytical skills. The Coordinator will report to the Director of the ePortfolio Initiative and be a member of the ePort Executive Committee.

The ePortfolio Initiative aims to improve curriculum, teaching, learning, and assessment of learning at IUPUI through the development and implementation of an electronic student learning portfolio. The initiative's components and activities include faculty development; pilot projects funded through an internal grant process; integration of the ePortfolio with other major campus initiatives, including the academic plan; and software

planning and development. The program involves IUPUI faculty from multiple disciplines, as well as administrators and staff from at least six university offices.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Becoming knowledgeable about electronic portfolios in higher education and the IUPUI ePort program.
- Working with faculty and administrative leaders of the ePort program to ensure that its various parts and sub-projects continue to move forward and that goals are met.
- Planning and organizing faculty development activities and events related to ePort.
- Developing and updating the content of the ePort website.
- Developing Institutional Review Board materials for the project, as needed.
- Developing planning and progress reports, timelines, and task charts for sub-projects.
- Coordinating a small grants program that funds curriculum development around ePort.
- Staffing ePort committees (e.g., scheduling and attending meetings, writing minutes, ensuring follow-up on meeting-generated tasks).
- Disseminating the ePort initiative, including participating in workshops and conferences for various academic audiences.
- Co-authoring articles for publication in relevant academic journals.

Required Qualifications:

- Demonstrated ability to coordinate complex projects and communicate and collaborate effectively with multiple stakeholders.
- Ability to prioritize, solve problems, address complex issues, and multi-task with minimal supervision.
- Very strong organizational and analytical abilities and excellent written and oral communication skills.
- Understanding of current higher education issues.
- Expertise with basic office computer software tools: Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint, Outlook.
- Master's degree required; advanced degree preferred.

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications

Application Process: In keeping with IUPUI's commitment to increase the diversity of the campus community, candidates from less represented populations and/or individuals who have experience working in culturally diverse environments are particularly encouraged to apply. Candidates should submit a letter of interest providing evidence of the qualifications outlined above, c.v., and the names, addresses and telephone numbers of at least three references able to comment on the applicant's qualifications for the position. Electronic submission is encouraged. The search and screen committee will begin review of applications on October 20, 2008, and will continue until the position is filled.
