It's been a busy week at the Sakai Foundation and in the community. We have a new version of software almost ready; the release team is in the final stages of preparing the 2.7.0 release candidate. More than 50 people have contributed to this version, so it's a true product of the community. Also, conference preparations are well underway. Nearly 400 people from 6 continents are already registered, with new registrations flowing in daily. In addition to what promises to be a thought provoking keynote by Anya Kamenetz, the author of DIY U: Edupunks, Edpreneurs and the Coming Transformation of Higher Education, we're looking forward to hearing from the winners of the Teaching with Sakai Innovation Awards. The awards were announced this week. Scott Bowman, Texas State San Marcos, Sally Knipe, Charles Sturt University, Joshua Danish, Indiana University Bloomington, and Karen Swenson, Virginia Tech, will show us some of the best examples of teaching and learning in higher education.

We're doing our best to be green at this year's conference, and are actively seeking ways to cut down on the amount of paper distributed. For example, most attendees will travel

4. Sakai-Based Courses Win Major Awards in China

Beijing University of Posts and Telecommunications (BUPT), one of China's major providers of distance learning and a Sakai institution, recently won the National Excellent Course Awards (Cyber-Education) from China's Ministry of Education for three fully online courses they developed. The courses included: Data Structure(Java) (http://jx2.buptnu.com.cn/data_structure/), Theory of digital telecommunication (http://jx2.buptnu.com.cn/digit_comm/), and Mobile Telecommunication (http://jx2.buptnu.com.cn/mobile_comm/) which were all developed and delivered using Sakai.

On a related note, BUPT hosted the 2010 International Virtual Learning Environment conference on May 12-14 which brought over 60 institutions and 200+ educators from around China together to discuss both the technology and teaching associated with distance education. Presentations included a broad range of topics, including Sakai with a keynote from Josh Baron, Chair of the Sakai Foundation Board of Directors, who provided and overview of Sakai, examples of innovative teaching with Sakai and a look at Sakai 3. In addition, John Leasia and Zhen Qian, from the University of Michigan, presented on Michigan's Sakai use and some of the technology they use to run their enterprise implementation.
