Sakai Beta Release

The Sakai beta release, originally scheduled for June 15th, will be released on June 23rd as part of the SEPP Conference in Denver.

Work is progressing on the new beta release. Changes are being made to the package and directory structures to better organize legacy vs. new services and tools. Work has begun on the Sakai API definitions and implementations. A new tool registration capability will allow new tools to be easily added to the system.

Tools Team Update

The Sakai Tools Team is preparing a number of documents for release to core Sakai and SEPP. These will include information on User Interfaces and Style Guides, a Sakai Glossary, and Feature Set/Gap Analysis. The Tools Team has begun discussions with the SEPP Requirements Group to better coordinate mutual activities going forward.
