The Sakai program management and development team is still recovering from the overwhelming amount of input received in Denver from SEPP members. We were listening hard, which has caused us to re-think some of our plans. Clearly the Sakai APIs and other aspects of the core Sakai architecture need additional work, but we also want to solidify the core functionality and complete gap items. These demands to provide framework elements as soon as possible to support the development by the partners will figure into our work and release schedules right away.
