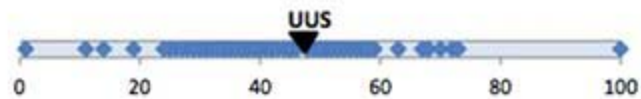

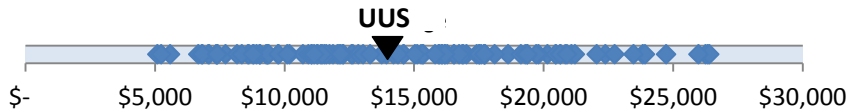

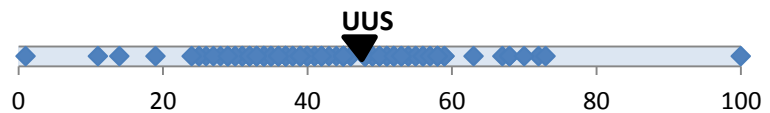

Percentage of full-time students who graduate within 6 years compared to other institutions

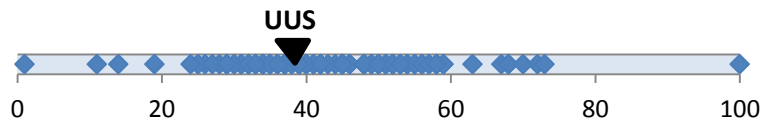
