7:08 "Sakai tools don't talk to each other in a coherent fashion (especially with regard to the needs of eportfolios and institutional assessment) _ . such a highly distributed environment without a shared vision and a coherent plan encourages people to resort to fiefdoms=E2=80=A6= not enough mechanisms for coherence across tools. -Without these mechanisms we are resorting to fiefdoms as a result people get protective and weird saying we can't touch this or that....."

How can the board/foundation help to bring some mechanisms of coherence

and integration so that educators can use the tools effectively?

23:03: how can we combat the nefarious effects of silos? How can we encourage institutions to work effectively and collaboratively as opposed to just being silos?"

23:50: "Board is a microcosm of the larger Sakai community there isn't always agreement on the board_. as a result we fall back on process = as a way of working productively_.that's as far as we've gotten in terms of strategy_with Michael (the incoming ED) we might move toward a more clearly defined strategic approach=E2=80=A6..I think we might find it hard to articulate a simple articulated strategy that the whole community would sign up to _.so there's a balance question between an open process philosophy and a more product oriented strategic approach_. we are in a place that is probably not optimal and we're moving gently in another direction but that's the best we have right now."

29:16: "_.should the foundation play a more assertive role in leading the community in making tough decisions where consensus cannot be established_."

29:30: "is the community looking for more assertiveness with respect to U.I issues? [not very many hands went up - but when the question was reversed (e.g. does anyone disagree that the community shouldn't focus on U.I?") not very many hands up either]

31:22: "tension in this community between total freedom to make any choice at a local and individual level and authoritative action."

39:11: "communities that are larger and much more distributed than Sakai have managed to articulate visions___. doing so facilitates integration points much faster_..having a vision of just surviving another day is not good enough _..need a strong vision"

41:30: "we need to encourage more interaction before things get built and try to develop things that fill gaps in more than one place"

44:30: "we are on the edge of something big_. we should be proud of that_. the other day I was having a conversation with somebody and they asked me 'why are we reinventing the wheel' and I looked at them and said 'we don't have a wheel?' we are inventing the wheel in this case=_. to think that it has all been resolved for providing a good user experience think again it has not_.there are some good examples (and some bad ones) and we can look to them and target them_. "at our university [Cambridge] we have kicked off an enormous challenge to actually simply describe how we teach and we've noticed tremendous diversity_.the variety between one instructor to another is enormous _.. what would be tremendously helpful is if institutions would start sharing their teaching approaches we are trying to support."

51:40: "_.looking around there are a number of conversations that bubble up aside from U.I_. the back button_.the technology we use to build Sakai_. and other things_.the foundation has been trying for a while to resolve these challenges and then the conversation dissolves_. what we need to do is identify the challenges and then find resources whether internally or by going out to foundations_..there is more agreement in this

room then there appears to be-. This spotlighting approach is the best for moving forward and it isn't a command and control approach."
