Subject: Permission to Use HR-XML Standards

The JA-SIG Collaborative (www.JA-SIG.org) has become a community of several hundred software developers in colleges and universities working on a number of open source projects. We have encouraged the use of open standards. I have been following the HR-XML specification developments for several years and find a number of these are applicable to our work. For example, in February at the XML Forum meeting of the Postsecondry Electronic Standards Council we suggested that HR-XML Contact Name, Person Name, and Postal Address be incorporated into their data exchange standards. This is especially important since many of the colleges and universities have PeopleSoft and SAP ERP systems and because I expect federal agencies to adopt HR-XML as well.

An open source ePortfolio project is underway. In addition to supporting a student's academic program and certification, some have suggested this be used as a portfolio when students seek employment. I believe ePortfolio should support the HR-XML education history, military history and resume documents.

To encourage standards-based development, we have provided a fully indexed CD-ROM with current relevant standards. I would like to include the applicable HR-XML standards in the next distribution. Although the HR-XML Consortium Website permits downloading specification to registered users,

the copyright statement in each specification appears to forbid download and any subsequent distribution unless there is written permission.

I would like to get permission to redistribute these documents to developers. Could you tell me the process we should follow to obtain written permission?

I appreciate your assistance.

Incidentally I have seen your name frequently in the HR-XML Consortium PDFs as author. Your documents and the bookmarks are the best I have seen in the standards efforts. We appreciate your extra effort.

I have also been working with Mark Jones at the National Student Clearinghouse. We expect to provide software that will link the colleges and universities with NSC in real-time using the HR-XML standards.
