IEEE LOM Update

Ingo Dahn from the University of Koblenz informed the Common Cartridge Project Group about errors found in the IEEE XML LOM Schema. His post is below:

Dear colleagues,

late in 2005 IEEE has published a standard XML binding for the Learning Objects Metadata Standard (see <http://ieeeltsc.org/wg12LOM/1484.12.3/>). The documents published by IEEE include a set of non-normative XML schemas. In order to overcome reported problems when using these schemas to validate instance documents with a number of tools, the Knowledge Media Institute Koblenz of the University Koblenz-Landau/Germany provides on its server patched versions of those schemas at the URL

<http://iwm.uni-koblenz.de/xsd/IEEE-LOM/>

The patches are minor and are documented within the schemas. For further documentation please refer to the official IEEE documentation mentioned above. The schemas provided should not change the set of conformant instance documents. A side effect of these patches is that the strict, loose and custom variants have been separated. Just in case - any problem with these patches should be reported through

I am sorry that we cannot provide a LOM help desk. So please use this URL only to report problems, notably any observed deviation from the normative part of the IEEE LOM XML binding or incompatibility with tools in general use.

In order to adapt IEEE LOM to the needs of particular communities we recommend to develop an Application Profile of the "loose" schema following the IMS Application Profiling Guidelines which are available at

The tools from the Telcert project (<http://www.opengroup.org/telcert/>) support this process for the patched LOM binding schema as for any other valid XML binding. Notably the SchemaProf profiling tool provided by our institute at

QTI Assessment Project Group	The QTI Assessment Project Group has completed QTI v2.1 Public Draft specification (now available on the IMS website) and is working on the Final specification.
Packaging Project Group	The Packaging Project Group has completed the v1.2 Public Draft specification and is working on a rev. 2 version Public Draft that will give implementers a longer than usual adoption period before the spec becomes Final early 2007.
Common Cartridge Project Group	The Common Cartridge Project Group is working on the Base Document specification.
Enterprise Services Special Interest Group	The Query Services work will be folded into a new release and update of the Enterprise Services specification. The group is gathering use cases and preparing a charter for approval.
