Article 4:

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

OpenEAI Software Foundation (the "Foundation") is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). Specifically, the Foundation's purpose is to provide research for the public through the open-source software the Foundation develops and sponsors.

Article 5:

Other Provisions:

(i) No part of the Foundation's net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private individual. No substantial part of the activities of the Foundation shall include the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. The Foundation shall not participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any political candidate for public office.

(ii) Upon the dissolution of the foundation, the Board of Directors, after paying all of the debts of the Foundation, shall distribute the remaining assets of the foundation to such organization or organizations as are organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, literary, scientific or educational purposes as shall at the time be described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
